One way to participate in the poultry project is to grow a group of 12 baby chicks furnished by Monroe County UT/TSU Extension. The 4-H'er receives 12 baby chicks and the responsibility for growing and returning 3 (three) grown pullets to the poultry sale. The 4-Hers will receive the chicks in March or April and the sale will be in August or September. To participate in this activity, you will need to fill out an application along with a \$40.00 deposit. Income from the sale will be used to purchase chicks next year and also possibly as prize money for the 4-H'ers participating. Returning this application does not guarantee that you will receive chickens. We receive more applications yearly than the number of chicks available. Priority will be given to the application received in our office from the date of your 4-H club meeting.
