4th Grade: (3) Muffins- any kind



Suggested: Plain, Fruit/nut, Bran/whole wheat, Cornmeal- plain or Mexican



5th Grade: (3) Biscuits- any kind

Suggested: Plain, Cheese, Fruit

6th Grade: (3) Cookies- any kind





7th Grade: (3) Cupcakes- any kind

Suggested: Unfrosted, frosted, vanilla, chocolate, strawberry

8th Grade: (1/2) Quick Loaf Bread- any kind

Suggested: Banana Nut, Pumpkin, Zucchini 1/2 Loaf, Yeast Bread 1/2 Loaf, Sourdough
