4-H Clover Bowl

The 4-H Clover Bowl will be happening in the months of April and May! The contest has been very popular and also very competitive for the past 15 years. Your teachers will have a copy of the question sets in the month of December that you need to study. The questions are divided into sections of 4-H, Agriculture, LifeSkills, Science, Government, and Tennessee History and Geography. This year, youth will qualify for the county contest by taking an online quiz at the school in March. The top 8 individuals in each grade will advance to the county by the highest scores on the test. After the top scores, we will select the next highest 3 or 4 scores to serve as alternates. The county contest is set up like a scholar's bowl event, with each person having a buzzer to try to answer the questions correctly in the shortest amount of time. There will be 4 students on a team per grade level. You can begin studying the questions as soon as each class receives them.

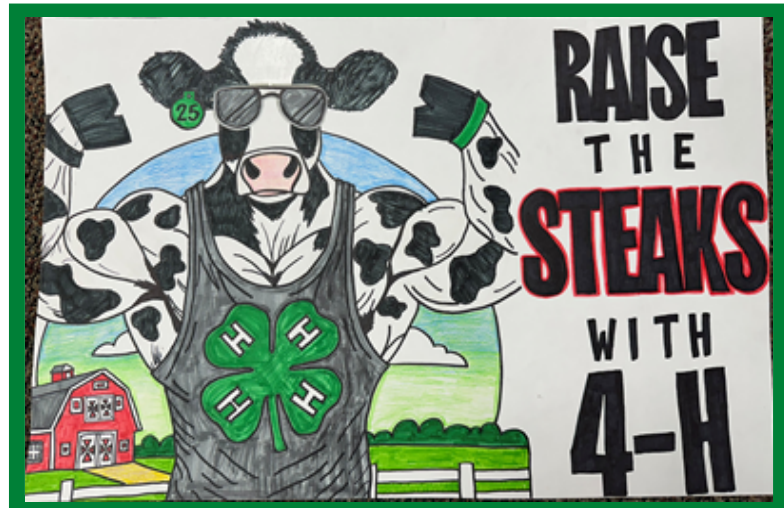

POSTERS ARE DUE AT YOUR JANUARY MEETING!

- Must be a horizontal poster that is 14x22 inches
- Write name, grade, teacher and school on the back of your poster
- No 3D objects that extend more than 1/8 inch
- Nothing should be placed on or blocking the emblem
- The stem of the clover should always turn to the right
- Use the whole emblem, do not distort or wrap the dimensions
- No copyrighted characters (Mickey Mouse, Bugs Bunny, etc.)
- Do **NOT** fold or roll up your poster
